

# Teacher Strike Action currently planned for Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> August

On 15<sup>th</sup> August teachers around New Zealand are planning to take strike action. This morning we were informed that the members of NZEI, the primary teachers union have voted to strike for the full day should strike action come to pass. Between now and then, negotiations will continue and we may find that the planned strike action does not go ahead, however we will keep you informed as the time approaches. It is important

families understand the reasonning behind this planned action.

It is the first time in 24 years that teachers have felt they need to stand firm for conditions of work and pay to secure our children's future positive experiences in the education system.

The main reasons contributing to the decision, at this stage, to strike are around providing positive working conditions to attract and retain our teachers, so they have more time to teach and so we have a truly inclusive school system where all children can learn and thrive.

We hear statistics like there are 40% less teacher graduates in the last 5 years, yet our student numbers are growing rapidly. We also hear that a large proportion of teachers who train leave the profession within the first 5 years of

teaching. The quality of teaching is the single biggest in-school impact on children's progress and achievement, so it's important we continue to attract high quality people into the teaching profession.

Schools are also facing a desperate need for more resourcing for increasing numbers of children with additional learning needs. Budget 2018 saw a welcome increase in resourcing for children with additional needs, (for example extending ORS funding to a further 250 children a year) but resourcing needs to be ratcheted up so that thousands, not hundreds get the support they need.

We don't want to end up with larger class sizes, children with their learning needs unmet and teachers leaving the profession simply because schools aren't resourced to do the best job they can. These issues can only be solved by providing schools with more staffing and more resourcing, and by ensuring we make teaching an attractive profession to join — and stay in.

At Marist we have experienced the challenge of recruiting in the current market recently. Finding great teachers is very difficult reflecting the fact that we are in the midst of a major teacher shortage currently.

I hope this helps explain why teachers have chosen the possibility of strike action and if a negotiaion is not reached before August 15<sup>th</sup> our school community will support our teachers on this day.

At last nights Baord meeting the Board of Trustees voted to close the school for the duration of the strike as health and safety of our students is paramount and keeping the school open with a small number of staff and reduced leadership is not in the best interests of our children. We have been in touch with Kelly Club and they have confirmed that they will be offering their services to those families who require it should the strike go ahead from 7am to 6pm on the day.



Katherine Kelly is returning on Thursday lunchtimes to take Irish Dancing classes. She is starting a beginners class at lunch time starting on the 8th of February.


