Message from the Principal......

Kia ora te whānau

We cannot ignore the tragedy that took place in Christchurch on 15 March, and its impact on every single one of us. At school our priority has been to support our children, staff and families in whatever way they need to make sense of this event. We followed the advice of the Ministry of Education, which was to acknowledge the event in an age appropriate way, to encourage the children to talk to an adult if they are worried, and to emphasise the good actions that have followed. We had a mufti day, with the proceeds donated to those most affected by the tragedy, as well as the whole school stopping at 1.40pm for two minutes of silence. We were very proud of the children who showed great love and respect for those hurt by this tragedy during this commemoration. I have attached to this newsletter a letter from Bishop Patrick Dunn, giving some advice from the New Zealand Police in the wake of this tragic event.

Finally, as we near the end of this powerful liturgical season of Lent we are reminded by Pope Francis that 'In Jesus, love has triumphed over hatred, mercy over sinfulness, goodness over evil, truth over falsehood, life over death'. It is a time to renew our encounter with Christ through the sacraments, to think about Christ's presence in our lives today and to help the poor and the vulnerable in our world.

Netsafe Tips for Parents:

Strong passwords: A strong password helps protect the information in your online profiles or accounts. Teach your child how to choose strong passwords, by reading <u>how to choose a good password</u>.

Information to protect online:

- Login details and passwords
- Bank account details
- Home address
- Phone numbers
- Birthdate
- Personal information that could be used to guess security questions for online accounts

You should also talk about personal details they could share online, such as where they are and the school they attend. This includes sharing their location – some apps allow you to share your current location with friends, or publicly.

Not everything is as it seems: It can seem like common knowledge to adults, but sometimes kids don't understand that people are not always who they say they are online. Talk to them about friending or communicating with people they don't know offline. For young children especially, they shouldn't friend someone online who they don't know personally offline.

Digital footprint: Teach your child that they need to think about what they post online, and that what they post online leaves a "digital footprint" about them. <u>Find out more about digital footprints.</u>

A letter from Bishop Patrick Dunn to all Parishes, Schools, Ethnic Communities and Religious Orders in the Auckland Diocese

The New Zealand Police wish to provide reassurance and advice to all the numerous communities throughout the country. They are aware that after the tragic events of last Friday in Christchurch, people may have some concerns and questions which the police are happy to address.

Their primary concern is to keep all New Zealand communities safe, and they have sent the following information which they would like us to give and to promote to all our communities.

Therefore I ask that the following message from the New Zealand Police be made available immediately to all our parishioners, school communities and ethnic chaplaincies.

- Police have been present outside all Mosques and Islamic Centres around the country as a precautionary measure to ensure the safety of our communities.
- Some police on the streets are currently armed. Again, this is a precautionary measure in response to the events in Christchurch and you should not feel alarmed.
- We are not currently aware of any specific threats but we are doing this as a precaution to protect our people and ensure they can go about their customs and religious traditions in peace and without incident.
- Police will be visiting all religious centres and places of worship as a precaution to provide advice and reassurance.
- We want everyone in our community to remain vigilant. Our message to everyone is simple: if you see something suspicious, say something call Police on 111 immediately.
- If you wish to talk to someone in Police, we have dedicated Police staff who are always available to talk to our ethnic communities and provide safety advice and reassurance.
- In the event that an emergency situation happens, stay calm and phone emergency services by calling 111 immediately.
- In this situation, our staff will do our best to respect the religious customs and traditions of
 places of worship, however in an emergency situation, our priority will always be first and
 foremost to protect the community and do everything we can to ensure the safety of members
 of the public.
- In an emergency event, please listen and abide by the directions of Police staff and emergency
 responders at all times.
