Parish News: - Alpha Programme


Alpha is a parish tool for evangelisation based on hospitality, sharing and open conversation.

The programme is a series of sessions exploring the Christian faith, usually run over eleven weeks by lay leaders on behalf of the parish. Each talk looks at a different question around faith and is designed to create conversation. No two Alphas look the same, but generally they have three key things in common: food, a talk and good conversation

Our parish are looking for leaders to lead this programme. There will be two evenings on **Tuesday 23rd July and 30th July** to look at the content of the course so people can make an informed decision about what Alpha is about and what commitment is required for the leaders.

 - They can help young people with online bullying, abuse, harassment and other challenges they might face online.
- If they come to you for help, count to ten before you react.
 - o If you overreact or take away the technology, then you're less likely to be the first port of call next time something happens. Focus on fixing the issue, not on punishing or confiscating their devices.
