# SAMOAN LANGUAGE WEEK AT MARIST:

In week 7 Marist celebrated Samoan Language week. The theme for the week was 'Tapena sou ōso mo lau malaga' which in English means 'Prepare yourself a gift for your travels'.

This year's theme urges us to prepare for the journey ahead. It highlights the need to honour, respect and share the gifts of our life's journey. As Pacific Peoples when we prepare for travel, we take our traditions with us, allowing us to share our ōso (gifts) with everyone we meet along the way. And with these gifts we build, nurture and strengthen our language, culture and identity.

Fa'afetai Lava to our Samoan students for sharing their gifts of their culture, language and who they are proudly to all their non-Samoan friends.

Each class created their own Samoan Lei's with the guidance of **Sophia (Year 6, Cultural Leader)**.



**Seron, Toalei and Lily (Year 3)** shared some traditional Samoan dances.

**Brooke (Year 5)** created a Samoan Museum of precious items for students to see.



**Elijah (Year 6)** went around the classes sharing Samoan prayers and also shared a traditional Samoan weapon to our Samoan Museum.

**Kingston (Year 2) & Mischa (Year 1)** taught Bernard how to do the sign of the cross in Samoan.

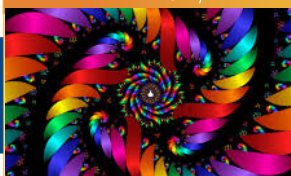

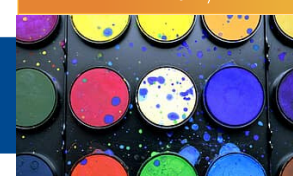
